- **Certified Public Accountant (CPA)**

  - Requires rigorous education, exams, and continuing education.
  - Specializes in tax, auditing, and financial advisory services.
- **Enrolled Agent (EA)**
  - A tax-focused certification granted by the IRS.
  - Specializes in tax preparation, audits, and representation before the IRS.
  - Ideal for businesses with complex tax situations.
- **Chartered Accountant (CA)**
  - Recognized internationally (similar to CPA in the U.S.).
  - Offers expertise in financial management, auditing, and compliance.
